

The application seeks to approve alterations to the filed licensing plans for the store.			
Implementation works have commenced and all works are being phased with the works completing on or about February 2020. John Lewis are essentially decreasing the size of their branch by losing space on upper floors which is to be redeveloped into other retail and leisure units for the shopping centre.			
In summary the alterations are:			
Upper ground			
The retail space on this floor is being reduced (by half or thereabouts) thus changes to the remaining retail space			
First floor			
As above and the Partners Dining Room (PDR) is being relocated to this floor with new customer toilets next to the Customer Place to Eat (licensed for on sales). The PDR is licensed for on sales (for Partners and their bona fide guests) in addition there are other retail changes/layout/tills.			
Lower ground floor			
There are some internal changes and the retail space is being slightly increased into what was a back of house area

  - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
  - o any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
  - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
  - o any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.
